

Tim Webb grew up working on farms before embarking on a career in journalism. Two decades later he changed direction to work in conservation. His work has contributed to the management of rail and road side management in London and around the M25. He has been involved in species reintroductions on heathland, coastal and estuary realignment projects and project managed a study on the decline of the urban house sparrow. Tim is a founder Trustee of the National Park City Foundation, the charity behind London being declared the world's first National Park City. He is a board Director of London Parks and Gardens Trust, and both campaigns and champions the adoption of green infrastructure and sustainable development in urban environments. Areas of interest include connecting people with nature, urban farming and improving access to public spaces
