






- Run horticulture and arboriculture training

- Raise awareness and demonstrate best practice




- Developing, fundraising, delivering and maintaining street tree projects for 15 years










Involving Community – the issues











We need communities to

- be champions of the trees in their streets
- put pressure on local politicians
- provide us with key local knowledge
- let us know if a tree is struggling
- get involved in watering the tree
- educate others about the benefits
- be in it for the long-term



For communities to develop a sense of ownership they need

- 1. a stake in the project
- 2. a way of being involved
- 3. the capacity to actually get involved in the process.

- Re-connect with nature
- Understand costs and benefits
- Ascribe value to public benefits
- Minimise costs and maximise benefits
- Utilise costs to create stakes





Finding opportunities for involvement


- Start early
